## Report of the Clerk / matters for decision: -

## 875 Highways and Footpaths

Tarmac over hydrants – complaint to be made to highways that the recent missed official closure and subsequent un-notified 3 hour closure on the morning of Saturday 30<sup>th</sup> September covered drains and hydrants with tarmac and in places was not to the edge of the carriageway and no return visit has been seen to rectify the faults with consequent problems for drainage in the storms since. None of the reported potholes were filled in during this visit.

Footpath in Dale erosion of path and river clearance

English Nature are to be contacted to raise the following issues: The recent storms have seen the felled trees across the river cause water pressure issues with rapid erosion and further damage to footpaths and the Dale in general. It is also noted that the dipper

population is being adversely affected by the lack of clear low flight route along the river with the blockages and their nesting sites are endangered by the higher flooding caused.

#### 876 Allotments

No issues – renewals will be sent out in December with the rate raised by £2 for a full plot.

#### 877 Bus Shelter project

Cllrs Hawley and Walton have viewed the shelter and agreed that this be a project for next spring. The deteriorated noticeboards were agreed as a worthwhile cause to apply for a grant from our District Councillors to repair/replace.

# 878 Active Improvements

Village in Bloom – the bulb drive for the verges is underway with donations received for parishioners towards the costs. Thanks were expressed to all who have donated or planted their own bulbs at the session last weekend which saw hundreds of bulbs placed in the verges. The volunteers who are keen to provide raised bed/trough under the village sign displays will be asked to expand on their ideas and management for these positions.

The Christmas Tree – decorations are suggested in the form of community commemorations that can be hung on the tree. This will be explored further with parishioners asked to drop off in a box at the church to enable uniformity in hanging.

#### 879 DDDC Car Park

DDDCIIr Steve Flitter attended a meeting in the car park immediately after the request to view and took comment back to the Car Park's review. He was appraised of the toilet block situation and the Committee reviewing this is aware of our unique circumstance. Council noted that it is illegal for councils to spend car park revenue on other expenses and will query just how the parking fees are spent to justify their high levels that mean most visitors jam up the streets rather than pay and community events use local farm fields leaving an underused facility. Council wishes to see the fee for this car park abolished.

#### 880 EV Charging

#### 881 Free tree scheme for Parishes

Council had a limited response on the last purchase and it was noted that autumn is a better time as the Woodlands Trust offer packages twice a year. Council will revisit this in the new Council year.

## 882 Neighbourhood Watch

A £200 DDDC grant has been received on behalf of the group thanks to our District Councillors. The group next meets on 13<sup>th</sup> December and will finalise the text system.

## 883 Signposting of Local Amenities

Cllr Truscott raised the idea of signposts at the junction and at the Triangle to highlight the Village Hall, Church and Dale. The idea received support and costs will be brought to the next meeting for a decision on how to fund.
